



Twin Peaks Traffic Interchange

Project Fact Sheet March 2010

Project Overview:

The new Twin Peaks Interchange will be located on Interstate 10 (I-10) at exit 245 between the Avra Valley Road and Cortaro Road interchanges. The improvements will extend Twin Peaks Road over the Santa Cruz River, to Camino de Mañana and Linda Vista Boulevard east of I-10. This project will also incorporate an overpass at the Union Pacific Railroad tracks east of I-10. A new access road, Tiffany Loop, will be built to provide local business access on the west side of I-10.

The benefits of the interchange include:

- Greatly reduce travel time in northwestern Pima County and increase safety by relieving traffic from other busy streets, such as Cortaro Rd, and utilizing Twin Peaks road instead.
- Connect to Marana's upcoming widening and roadway improvements of Camino de Mañana, realigning the roadway north to the intersection of Tangerine Road and Dove Mountain Boulevard.
- Unite the growing Dove Mountain community with Continental Ranch and provide easier access to I-10.
